


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

The problem is how to achieve this without imposing a bureaucratic or elitist system. There are various possibilities that could be considered, e.g. a qualification certificate based on proven experience; an independent assessor awarding Michelin style stars; a compulsory short course that trainers have to pass before 'qualifying'; a trade union that will assess members who wish to join.
